Pennsylvania's Fastest Growing Union of Frontline Nurses and Healthcare Professionals Proudly Endorses Former Philadelphia City Councilmember Cherelle Parker for Mayor

**Philadelphia, PA -** The Pennsylvania Association of Staff Nurses and Allied Professionals (PASNAP), representing nearly 10,000 frontline nurses and healthcare professionals across the Commonwealth, many located in and around the city of Philadelphia, proudly endorses the former two-term City Councilmember and Majority Leader Cherelle Parker for Mayor of Philadelphia in the upcoming General Election.

"I know her as someone who will speak for the voiceless and stand fearlessly alongside those who are ready to fight."

PASNAP has long supported Parker, who served for 10 years as the State Representative for the 200th Legislative District in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives prior to her election to City Council in November 2015. Her political relationships at both the city and state level, and her knowledge of and love for Philadelphia's workers and all its citizens run deep.

"For our professions and for our patients, PASNAP proudly endorses Cherelle Parker for Mayor of Philadelphia," says May. "As the 100th mayor of Philadelphia – and the first woman to hold the office! – we believe she will keep the needs of patients in Philadelphia and the needs of their direct care providers foremost in her mind."
